B. SOLID WASTE: Waste Mass Liquids Addition:

-Landfill management has requested and obtained approval from the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) for waste mass liquids addition under the Federal Research, Development and Demonstration Rule-40 CFR 258.4 (RD&D). Historically, the Landfill has not been permitted to accept any wastes that contained free liquids. With KDHE approval, it will now be permitted. Liquid addition to waste has been proven to accelerate degradation and mass stability. It will also provide another service to Landfill customers.

Phil Hathcock, Solid Waste Director, said examples of liquids that will be accepted are car wash clean-outs, mechanic bay clean-outs, etc. Hathcock asked for approval of the following fee schedule:

- \$ 25.00 for a 55 gallon drum
- \$100.00 for a 250 gallon tote
- \$.25 per gallon for amounts over 250 gallons

Commissioner Schartz asked if there is a list of acceptable liquids and also inquired about the danger of the liner breaking down. Hathcock said, per regulation, they are not allowed to take hazardous wastes. Hathcock explained there will be analytical tests done on the liquid waste prior to accepting it into the landfill.

Commissioner Schartz moved to accept the proposed pricing structure for liquid acceptance at Barton County Sanitary Landfill.
Commissioner Straub seconded the motion.
All voted aye. Motion passed.

C. COUNTY SERVICES: Informational Update:

-Mr. Boeckman will provide the informational report of work completed during the last period. The report, which will be made available to the media, will serve as a public reminder of the services provided by the County on a regular basis.


