I. OPENING BUSINESS:

III. NEW BUSINESS:

A. PROCLAMATION 2016-06: National Public Safety Communications Officers Week, April 10 – 16, 2016:

-Dena Popp, 911 Deputy Director, has asked that the Commission consider the adoption of Proclamation 2016-06, National Public Safety Communications Officers Week. In part, the Proclamation honors Public Safety Communications Officers for their vital role in protecting the life and property of Barton County citizens.

Dena Popp, 911 Deputy Director, said the first line of getting help in an emergency is dispatch and said dispatchers are rarely recognized. Law enforcement is referred to as the thin blue line, fire is the thin red line and dispatch is the thin gold line that holds it all together. Popp asked the Commissioner to adopt the proclamation recognizing National Public Safety Communications Officers Week.

Commissioner Straub moved to adopt Proclamation 2016-06, as National Public Safety Telecommunications Week and thank you Ms. Popp for sharing. Commissioner Schartz seconded the motion. All voted aye. Motion passed.

B. PROCLAMATION 2016-07: Child Abuse Awareness and Prevention Month – April, 2016:

D. GREAT PLAINS DEVELOPMENT: Continuation of Membership:

-Great Plains Development assists the County, and its Cities, with Small Business Administration Ioan applications, Community Development Block Grant writing, economic development revolving Ioans and community strategic planning. The Commission will be updated on recent programs, new CDBG information on the County and Cities, discussion about CDBG-Revolving Loan fund and possible future changes and new planning services (Strategic Doing) available from GPDI. The Commission will be asked to approve the County's 2016 membership.

Bob Wetmore, Co-Director, Great Plains Development, said they cover the 28 counties of Southwest Kansas. Great Plains Development has four separate loan funds. Due to changes in the revolving loan program, the County can no longer partner with the City. Wetmore said they can, however, ask for separate rulings on larger projects. Currently, there is \$188,848.00 in the loan fund not being utilized. Wetmore also said that a new web-portal was made available through Network Kansas Grant and Richard Boeckman contribution as a director is much appreciated.

- WHEREAS, all children deserve to have warm homes, loving hugs, tender care, parents and adults who listen and promote self-esteem, give quality time, provide necessary food shelter, clothing and attention; and
- WHEREAS, effective child abuse prevention programs succeed because of partnerships created among social service agencies, schools, faith communities, civic organizations, law enforcement agencies and the business community; and
- WHEREAS, through partnerships and collaborations, the Dell Hayden Memorial Child Advocacy, Central Kansas Court Appointed Special Advocates, Department for Children and Families, St. Francis Community Services, Child Abuse Prevention and Education, Great Bend Regional Hospital's SANE Program, Juvenile Services and law enforcement officers work daily to address child abuse and neglect.
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED** by the Board of County Commissioners of Barton County, Kansas, that the month of April, 2016, is declared as Child Abuse Awareness and Prevention Month; and

PROCLAMATION 2016-08

Sexual Assault Awareness Month - April, 2016

- WHEREAS, Sexual Assault Awareness Month calls attention to the fact that sexual violence is widespread and impacts every person in Barton County; and
- WHEREAS, rape, sexual assault and sexual harassment harm communities as (statistics show) one in five women and one in 71 men will be raped at some point in their lives; and
- WHEREAS, child sexual abuse prevention must be a priority to confront the reality that one in six boys and one in four girls will experience a sexual assault before age 18; and
- WHEREAS, young people experience heightened rates of sexual violence and youth ages 12-17 are 2.5 times as likely to be victims of rape or sexual assault; and
- WHEREAS, on campus, one in five women and one in 16 men are sexually assaulted during their time in college; and
- WHEREAS, community members must be educated about sexual violence prevention, supporting survivors and speaking out against harmful attitudes and actions; and
- WHEREAS, prevention is possible through increase education, awareness and community involvement; and

WHEREAS, Barton County strongly supports the efforts of the Family Crisis Center, Inc. along with national, state, and local partners, and of every citizen, to actively engage in public and private efforts to prevent sexual violence and create a safer environment.

- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED by the Board of County Commissioners of Barton County, Kansas, that April, 2016, is declared as Sexual Assault Awareness Month; and
- **FURTHER**, that all citizens are encouraged to learn more about prevention and to be proactive in creating a safer environment.
