I. OPENING BUSINESS:

III. NEW BUSINESS:

A. COUNTY CLERK'S OFFICE: Request for Approval – Added / Abated / Escaped / Refunded Taxes:

-Donna Zimmerman, County Clerk, will present a listing of Added / Abated / Escaped / Refunded Taxes. Orders for these actions are kept on file in the County Clerk's Office. These are used to correct assessments and are requested by the County Appraiser's Office or the County Clerk's Office.

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Commissioner Davis moved to the Listing of Added / Abated / Escaped / Refunded Taxes as reviewed by the County Appraiser and presented by the County Clerk and direct the Chairman to sign on behalf of the Commission.

Commissioner Schartz seconded the motion.

All voted aye. Motion passed.

B. COMMUNICATIONS: Replacement of the Net Clock:

-The 911 Center utilizes a Net Clock to synchronize what time is recorded on the CAD servers, radio and recording devices. This synchronization reduces liabilities in court, is essential for first responder reporting requirements and is highly recommended for all mission critical entities. The Net Clock will be at the end of its shelf life and will cease to operate on April 19, 2020. As it interfaces with the radios, Mobile Radio Service was asked to provide a quote for the purchase and installation of an updated Net Clock. Quoted at \$7,665.00, it is suggested that 911 Funds be used for this anticipated purchase.

Dena Popp, 911 Director, said Mobile Radio Service informed her that their 10-year-old Net Clock will come to end-of-shelf life in 2020. Popo said this critical piece of equipment synchronizes all of the servers and all the time on those servers, which reduces liability in court.

Commissioner Schartz moved to approve the purchase and installation of a Net Clock from Mobile Radio Services. Quoted cost of \$7,665.00 is to be paid from the 911 Fund, Maintenance of Machinery & Equipment Line, 080-86-5460.

Commissioner Davis seconded the motion.

All voted aye. Motion passed.

Kansas County Commissioners Association: 2020 Membership:

-The Commission has received an invoice for the 2020 dues for the Kansas County Commissioners Association. Tied closely to the Kansas Association of Counties, this organization is comprised of the Commissioners serving the 105 counties in Kansas. Education, training, partnering and seeking strategic alliances that benefit the interests of County government and its citizens are its core goals. The Commission will determine if they will retain membership in the Association.

Phil Hathcock, County Administrator, said this is our last invoice for our 2020 memberships. The cost remains unchanged from last year and is based on population.

Commissioner Schartz said this is the Commissioner's group that also belongs to KAC.

Commissioner Daily said the meeting and training is excellent.

Commissioner Schartz moved to retain membership in the Kansas County Commissioners Association. Membership dues of \$700.00 to be paid from the Commissioners account of the General Fund, Dues, Membership and Subscription Line, 001-02-5455.

Commissioner Daily seconded the motion.

All voted aye. Motion passed.


Commissioner Schartz made a motion to adjourn at 9:15 A.M.
