B. ROAD AND BRIDGE: 2020 Paint Striping Program:

-The Road and Bridge Department has received a quote from Straight Line Striping Inc. in reference to striping approximately 105 miles of County roads. The estimated cost, at no more than \$95,000.00, was 'uded in the 2020 Road and Bridge Budget as an expected operating expense.

Darren Williams, County Works Director, said the Road and Bridge Department will overlay and seal approximately a hundred miles in the Northwest part of the county. It is necessary to stripe the roads for safety and legal requirements. Williams said due to the specialized equipment needed to apply the paint and glass beads quickly and efficiently, Road and Bridge contracts out this work. Straight Line Striping out of Nebraska has performed this work for the past several years. Williams said the 2020 cost is \$17.76 per gallon for white paint and \$18.20 per gallon for yellow and noted the total cost depends on the total number of miles sealed. Williams said the cost increased about \$30 per mile this year.

Commissioner Daily moved to hire Straight Line Striping Inc. for the 2020 Paint Striping Program for a not to exceed price of \$95,000.00. Cost to be paid from the Road and Bridge Fund, Contract Construction Line, 002-92-6250.

VI. OTHER BUSINESS:

• Comm Kruckenberg: Straight Line is a good deal.

 Karen Winkelman, Health Director: Total number of confirmed cases in Kansas was 44 approximately 10 days ago and as of yesterday the number is 319 confirmed. On March 27th, a very difficult decision was made to issue an emergency order to place public gathering restrictions. On Saturday, the Governor signed a Stay-at-Home order effective at 12:01 A.M. this morning thru Sunday, April 19th. The preparent stated three reasons for doing so. To have uniformity across the state, to prevent

overnor stated three reasons for doing so. To have uniformity across the state, to prevent overwhelming hospitals, and to buy us some time to secure personal protective equipment. Essential

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usiness functions are listed in the executive order. It is up to the individual business to look at the order to determine if they are essential. Not aware of any confirmed cases in Barton County at this time. Her staff and customers are screened with questions and temperature. Medical providers are reporting to the Health Department within 4 hours when there is a suspect case. If someone is tested. the Health Department looks at 14 days prior to try to determine where it may have been contracted, makes a list of any contacts, and asks that they self-quarantine. They collected samples at a hot spot in the community identified by KDHE when someone became ill. Working with Emergency Management to get supplies. Do not want any barriers to exist in getting testing. Support has been phenomenal. Donna Zimmerman is our PIO, so news releases are coming thru her. Dr. Norman said they project a possible peak for mid-to-end of April. Dr. Norman said he was asked how you would know when to back off. He stated that will have to be evaluated every 1 to 2 weeks and reiterated how important social distancing is at this time. Winkelman thanked everyone for their support. We are in this together.

- Comm Daily: Do you have adequate number of test kits.
- Winkelman: Have a limited supply. They also have other means for collection.
- Comm Daily: Have you been in contact with other pharmacies to see if you can gather items to make the kits?
- Winkelman: Yes, they are limited too.
- Comm Schartz: Do we have outstanding tests we are waiting on results for?
- Winkelman: Yes we do. We have individuals who are under guarantine because of travel.
- Comm Schartz: If we get a positive, how will we get the information out?
- Winkelman: Will go through PIO Donna Zimmerman.
- Comm Daily: Quarantine in your home.
 Winkelman: Yes, and self-monitor for signs and symptoms.
- Comm Schartz: Doing a really good job and a really good team to manage the situation. Hearing a lot of good positive comments about the annex for the Treasurer's Office and how we are managing to get ork done. Keep your distance. This is not the time to let your guard down. When weather gets better - e temptation to gather will be greater.
