BRIDGE and LOW WATER CROSSING REPAIRS in BARTON COUNTY, KANSAS (042826-Updated)

Project Introduction

Notice is hereby given that Barton County, Kansas is soliciting quotes for bridge repairs at the following locations:

#1 - Stone Arch Bridge located on NE 230 Road 0.13 miles south of NE 50 Avenue. The project consists of removal of overburden on the existing arch and construction of a new reinforced concrete pavement measuring 24' in length and 24' wide. Upon completion of the pavement, the new pavement will be transitioned to existing grade with surfacing material supplied by the County. The pavement will be 8" thick and reinforced with #5 bars or better at 12" centers, each way.

#2 - Bridge 218 located on NE 220 Road 0.11 miles west of NE 60 Avenue. The project includes construction of a new reinforced concrete base for the existing two span stone arch bridge. The new base will measure approximately 36' in length and 24' wide and be reinforced with #5 bars or better at 12" centers, each way. Considerable undermining of the existing footing has occurred. A "toe wall" needs to be constructed at each end of the existing structure and backfilled with stabilization material supplied by the County. Slab thickness of the base will be a minimum of 8". Upon completion of the base, the new base will be backfilled to existing grade with onsite material.

#3 - Low Water Crossing #125 on NW 130 Road 0.04 miles east of NW 50 Avenue. The project includes removal (concrete and corrugated metal pipe) and saw cutting of a portion of the existing low water crossing and construction of a new reinforced concrete low water crossing measuring 28' in length and 24' wide. Also included is installation of a new corrugated metal pipe supplied by the County. Additionally, the new pipe will be beveled on both ends and a concrete "apron" will be poured around the end to minimize future erosion. Upon completion of the pavement, the new pavement will be transitioned to existing grade with surfacing material supplied by the County. The pavement will be 8" thick and reinforced with #5 bars or better at 12" centers, each way.

Vendor to provide all equipment, labor, supplies, insurance, and incidentals necessary to complete the work. Vendor to provide traffic control and dewatering of sites if needed.

Project Requirements

This project will be exempt from Kansas Sales Tax.

All vendors are to be prequalified with the Kansas Department of Transportation as outlined in Section 102 of the KDOT Standard Specifications. Barton County reserves the right to waive the requirement for prequalification based on the vendor's work history and qualifications.

Barton County reserves the right to waive any and all technicalities and to reject any and all quotes.

Project Funding Source

Funding provided by Barton County.

Project Timeline

Should work be awarded based on quote, timeline will be based on a mutually agreed upon schedule.

Additional Evaluation Criteria

The Barton County Commission award criteria may include, but is not limited to, pricing and vendor availability.

Barton County may choose to award the project based on any combination of project location quotes.

A separate lump sum quote shall be submitted for each project location.

Barton County will not consider any quote not prepared and not sent in accordance with the provisions hereof and may waive any informalities or reject any and all proposals.

Awarding Bids/Proposals/Contracts

Barton County reserves the right to proceed with the project after quotes are received. Barton County may choose to award the project based on any combination of project location quotes.

Barton County cannot enter into contracts with entities that have been suspended or debarred from participating in contracts supported with federal funds. For contracts over \$25,000 supported with federal funds, Barton County will verify that a contractor is not excluded or disqualified by either:

- Checking SAM (www.sam.gov);*
- Collecting a certification from that contractor; or*
- Adding a clause or condition to the cover transaction with that contractor.*

False or Misleading Statements

In the opinion of Barton County, if your quote or proposal contains false or misleading statements or references which do not support the function, attribute, capability, or condition of your company and the products and services outlined in your proposal, your proposal will be rejected.

Conflicts of Interest

Vendors must list any current or potential clients or projects which may be (or cause) a conflict of interest in working for Barton County and describe the possible extent of the conflict.

Modification of Quotes

Modifications to quotes already submitted will be allowed if submitted in writing before the deadline.
